The Student Conference provides an opportunity for research students to

- present papers to an audience of fellow-research students and get peer feed-back
- to participate in sessions on the research process and to discuss research issues with experienced and active researchers
- to help develop a network of contacts

Proposals are invited on citizenship and citizenship education in relation to social conflicts. Other related topics are for example values and value changes, social identity, social justice, war and peace, migration, acculturation, ethnic relationships, diversity, intercultural issues, social exclusion-inclusion, historical culture, sustainability, environmental issues, economic growth and economic crisis and their implications on citizenship and identity, employment, distribution of wealth and social justice and etc.

Papers are welcome from different disciplines including education, sociology, political science, history, psychology and philosophy.

Key information

- The student conference welcomes *participants*, who present a paper, and *audience members*, who do not present a paper but form part of the audience.
- The number of participants who will be selected to present their papers is limited to *twelve*. The number of audience participants will not be limited.
- The *deadline for applications is 25 March 2023*. We expect the demand for places to be high and we encourage you to send your proposal as early as possible.
- The conference will start on Wednesday, May 24 with morning and afternoon sessions from 9.00 am. On Thursday there will be only a morning session until 12.30 followed by a farewell lunch.
- **Presenting participants are expected to be present in all sessions of the student conference, from the very beginning to the very end. Please do not conceptualize your presence as at other conferences, namely coming to present your paper and then leaving. This is a joint, group endeavour with different activities that require your active presence during the one and a half day. Please apply only if you can be present during the whole process.**
- After the Research Student Conference students can attend the *Main CitEdEV Conference*, which immediately follows. Attendance to the main conference must be booked and paid for separately for those who are not covered by the network.
- For those who are not covered by the network the fee for the Student Conference is **€70**; the combined fee (Student Conference + Main **CitEdEV** is **€100**). The conference fees cover meals and refreshments in the conference sessions. No dinner. You will also be responsible for your travel and accommodation. We are working on offering affordable accommodation.

How to make a proposal

What to include with your proposal

You must submit an *abstract* of no more than 500 words. The abstract is used by the Conference Scientific Committee to decide if your paper appears to be of sufficient quality to be selected. The abstract should describe your proposal, telling your audience what it is about. Please write in full sentences not bullet points.

Attention: If you are at the beginning of your doctoral studies and you still do not have results, you provide a theoretical background, the research question and the planned (!) methodology and you can leave out the result section or describe the expected results.

ABSTRACT – 500 words maximum

What to include:

- a **Title** of the paper, the author (your full name) and the affiliation (your university, institute, city, country). Your e-mail address.
- a **Summary** of the project: what you have set out to do, how you have done it, the key findings and results. This consists of the following:
- an **Introduction:** clear statement of the problem that you are addressing, and a short theoretical background. These should then lead to declarations of project aims and objectives
- **Methodology:** participants of the study (if applicable), the basis of the technique that you are using or the procedure that you have adopted in your study
- a **Results** section (if appropriate): show illustrative examples of the main results of the work
- a **Conclusion** section, listing the main findings of your investigation, and
- **Further Work:** recommendations and thoughts about how the work could be progressed; other tests that could be applied, etc

In addition, and above the 500 words:

- Please also add at what year you are in your doctoral studies
- The name of your supervisor(s)
- Please indicate if you are included in your university's membership in the **CitEdEV Network** meaning that you are eligible for free participation.
